UNITED KINGDOM FIRST DAY CACHETS

IXth British Commonwealth Games

SUBJECT:

IXth British Commonwealth Games held in Edinburgh, Scotland, 16 to 25 July 1970. 42 countries attended and 121 events were staged. To commemorate this event three stamps and associated First Day Covers (FDC's) were issued on 17th July 1970 either by the British Post Office or privately.

THE ISSUED STAMPS - Games commemorative issue consists of three stamps, the first UK issue printed in 'Delacryl' (an offset litho technique) by De La Rue. 5d. local first class rate; 1s. 6d. and 1s. 9d. representing the airmail letter base rates to Commonwealth countries. All withdrawn 15th July 1971.

PLAN/SCOPE - FDC printing techniques, distribution and quantities issued when recorded, are shown. Variety of special FDI handstamps were in use.

TREATMENT - Chronological. Post Office cachets followed by private cachets.


RARITY - Important items backed in red. Several cachets difficult to acquire.



IX Commonwealth Games, Edinburgh, Scotland postcard. Printed by Valentine printers and publishers.


Post Office FDC's. Printed in two colour litho. Hand stamped 'Edinburgh British Philatelic Bureau' on FDI. Quantity printed of 'SPECIMEN' cachets not recorded. Cachet designer - Andrew Restall.






Cachet printed in two colour litho. depicting runners, cyclists and swimmers. 25mm circular FDI Edinburgh British Philatelic Bureau handstamp. Design superimposed cine film sequences conveying impression of movement - the stamps do likewise.

Post Office FDC showing non-competitive road cyclists. 'London W.C.' FDI handstamp. Printed colour litho. Qty printed unrecorded.






Post Office FDC. 'London SW.' FDI handstamp. Printed in litho. Qty. unrecorded.

7th Signal Regiment Stamp Club issued FDC. #353 of 400. Printed in silver guilt, brown, red, & green litho. 'FPO 1035' double ring FDI CDS. In 1970 Royal Corps of Signals, a British Army regiment, was based in Kota Belud Malaysia ('FPO 1035').


'Opening ceremony' Philart FDC. 'Edinburgh' FDI slogan handstamp. Printed in two colour lithograph. Qty. printed not recorded ('commercial in confidence'). Gyula László Vásárhelyi designed the artwork on these two cachets.








'Stuart' FDC. 'Edinburgh' FDI handstamp. Gold debossed design. Qty printed unrecorded.







Split back postcard produced by Cameo stamps printed in UK by Bennett Press, London. Printed in green litho. 'Edinburgh' FDI handstamp. Qty. printed not recorded. Cachet depicts cross country running which has never been held at a Commonwealth Games.

Two 'Stuart' covers - Thistle corporate logo die-stamped on bottom left of cachet. Since 1965 produced by A.M.Stuart of Southampton and sold for 6d. Stuart Covers now taken over by Cotswold Covers UK.

'Edinburgh' FDI thick handstamp. Printed in black vercotype and litho. Qty printed not recorded.






Athletics sports scene on blue, red, and yellow vercotype and litho. Thin ring 25mm 'Southampton' thin FDI handstamp. Qty printed not recorded.

FDC's issued by the Spastics Society of London (now called Scope). Produced to encourage recipients to donate to the Society. Two 'Taunton Somerset' FDI handstamps on a Croxley Script DL size envelope. One colour litho. cachet of a runner & Edinburgh Castle. Qty printed unrecorded.



Cameo International (London) FDC. Three colour litho. 'Huddersfield Yorkshire' FDI handstamp. Quantity printed not recorded.



Loftleidir Icelandic Airlines produced FDC. 'Folkestone Kent' FDI handstamp over a 5d. Games stamp. DL envelope printed in one colour litho. Qty. printed unrecorded. Covers sent to customers to promote their low cost airline. Flights in 1970 flew direct between Reykjavik and Glasgow, Scotland.

'Abbey' FDC. 'Edinburgh' FDI handstamp. Cachet featurers runners. Printed in litho. brown and gold. Designers endeavoured to continue the Games stamps (here the 5d.) design technique onto their FDC's to produce a depiction of complete harmony. #98 of 2000









Edinburgh Castle in multicoloured litho. 'London E.C.' FDI circular handstamp. Qty. printed not recorded.


'Philart' cachets designed by Richard Granger Barrett a British impressionist & modern artist.






